2. Read the following passage / case and answer the questions that follow :

A Writ Petition under Art. 32 of the Constitution of India was submitted by Shri Nandlal Bajaj for the issuance of a writ of Habeas Corpus for the release of his son, Inderjeet alias Billa, who had been detained by detention order passed by the District Magistrate, Ropar on 1-6-1981 under Section 3 of the Prevention of Blackmarketing and Maintenance of Supplies of Essential Commodities Act, 1980 on being satisfied that his detention was necessary with a view to preventing him from acting in any manner prejudicial to the maintenance of supplies of commodities essential to the life of the community. The detention order was challenged on various grounds. The first and foremost ground was that the procedure adopted by the Advisory Board in allowing legal assistance to the State and denying such assistance to the detenu was both arbitrary and unreasonable which is violative of Art. 21 read with Art. 14 of Indian Constitution. It is clear from Section 11(4) of the aforesaid Act that the detenu has no right to legal aid in the proceedings before the Advisory Board. But it does not preclude the Board to allow such assistance to the detenu, when it allowed the State to be represented by an array of lawyers. Further, the Advisory Board did not forward the record of the proceedings to the State Government. The latter confirmed the detention order under Section 12 of the aforesaid Act without due application of mind in the absence of record. This was a serious infirmity in the case and its procedure can not be considered in consonance with proceedings established by law. Hence the arbitrariness of the procedure adopted by the Advisory Board vitiated the order of detention and the continued detention of the detenu was held illegal.
