    Shrunk from the vast extent of all His honours,
    And cramped within a corner of
    The world?
  - (b) Soldiering .... is the coward's art of attacking mercilessly when you are strong, and keeping cut of harnis way, when you are weak. That is the whole secret of successful fighting.
  - (c) No, there's nothing we can do. (To Kattrin!) Pray, poor thing pray! There's nothing we can do to stop this bloodshed, so even if you can't talk, at least pray. He hears, if no one else does.
  - (d) Those who survive are those who do not defy the gravity of others. And those who desire even a Moment of freedom, find themselves hurled into space, doomed to crash with some unknown force. I no longer desire that freedom. I move, just move. Without meaning.
